DEPARTMENT AND HEART OF ILLINOIS FAIR GENERAL RULES

- PREMISE REGISTRATION IS VOLUNTARY TO EXHIBIT LIVESTOCK (beef, dairy, horses, swine, sheep, goats, poultry and rabbits). Choosing to register your premises puts you on the frontline of controlling and preventing the spread of animal disease. A disease outbreak can't be predicted but it can impact every segment of animal agriculture. Participation ensures that you have the information you need, when you need it most, to protect your animals and your investment. Registering a premises involves obtaining a seven-character alpha-numeric "identifier" for the farm, ranch, veterinary clinic or other site where livestock or fowl are handled, housed, managed or processed. If an exhibitor wants to register their animals an application form can be found on-line at www.agri.state.il.us/premiseid. Exhibitors who register on-line will receive a premises registration number immediately. An application can also be obtained by calling 1-866-299-9256. If completing application and returning by mail, it may take up to 4 weeks to receive the number. - Entries close July 1, 2011. All entries by mail must be postmarked not later than midnight, July 1, 2011, and must be accompanied by the full entry fee. **LATE ENTRY DEADLINE--Entries submitted after the July 1st regular deadline will be accepted IN PERSON at the Heart of Illinois Fair office between July 1, 2011, and Noon, July 5, 2011, under the late entry rule. Entries made during the late entry time period will be charged an additional \$4.00 per entry. Entries close when pens/or stalls are full.**
- Fees. Each junior exhibitor must purchase at least one \$12.00 (5) day exhibitor ticket and will then receive one (1) five day helper pass free. The exhibitor ticket of \$12.00 plus \$10.00 per lot entry fee and \$7.00 per head stall fee must accompany all applications for entry except champion lots. Group lots must be entered before the July 1, 2011 deadline. Stall fees are paid only once for animals stalled on grounds. No refunds will be made. Please use the YELLOW entry form marked JUNIOR LIVESTOCK ENTRY ONLY. Please complete all sections of the entry form fully. **A SEPARATE ENTRY BLANK IS REQUIRED FOR EACH DEPARTMENT.**
- HEALTH PAPERS WILL BE CHECKED AT 9:00 A. M, TUESDAY, JULY 12, 2011 IN THE SHEEP/SWINE BARN. NO PREMIUMS WILL BE PAID AND NO ANIMALS WILL BE ALLOWED TO SHOW IF REGISTRATION PAPERS ARE NOT CHECKED.**
- Please check both the GENERAL RULES section and the Illinois Department of Agriculture Rules at the front of the book as they may apply to your entry.
- The management reserves the right to close the entries when a sufficient number have been received to fill the stalls. Name and registry number of each animal must accompany entry. Substitution of animals will be permitted in case of illness, as long as the new entry meets all other regulations.
- Cattle will be dismissed after the completion of the show on Tuesday, July 12, 2011.
 Ownership of Animals
- To be eligible for competition all animals must be the property of the exhibitor, based upon records of the breed registry associations thirty days prior to entry deadline.**
- All dairy cattle registration papers will be checked on Monday evening by the superintendents.**
 Eligibility of Animals
- In the dairy breeds, cows 36 months old or over. Must have produced a calf within the past 18 months or prove to be in calf.
- In the dairy breeds, heifers under 2 and in milk must show as two year olds.
- No dairy calf under 3 months of age, at the time of the fair, is eligible for show.
- Registration papers will be checked on each animal in the show ring, just prior to the lot being judged.
- All animals must be owned and recorded in the name of the junior exhibitor and shown by the owner unless he or she is showing in two lots. In that case, a helper, which must be another junior exhibitor may assist.

15. No premiums will be paid unless cattle are shown in their respective lot in the show ring.
16. All waste straw and manure must be placed in containers provided on NORTH SIDE of livestock barns. Exhibitors failing to do so shall forfeit premium money earned.
17. No more than two premiums will be paid an exhibitor under 1 lot number.
18. If any breeds are represented by less than 5 (five) animals per breed the Superintendent and Fair Management reserve the right to combine those breeds in an AOB (class) category and show under one premium.
19. Entries for the Junior Show are limited to boys and girls living in the State of Illinois. Parents or guardians must reside in the State of Illinois and all exhibitors must not yet be nineteen (19) years of age on or before September 1 of the year previous to the fair.
